The live performance I chose to attend was at Brighton Bar in Longbranch on Halloween night. The jazz band I saw was the Ocean County College jazz band and the band leader was David R. Marowitz.

The overall feel of the venue was very laid back and quite loud even before the band began playing. However the look of the place was very dark, empty, and kind of seemed a little dirty.
